## Your photos could be in Tairua's 2026 Calendar

This is what you've been waiting for...this is a call out to all the amateur photographers in town! It's time to enter Tairua Information Centre's Calendar Photo Competition!

This annual competition has resulted in beautiful and popular photographic calendars featuring the people and scenery of our great little town. So, now's the time to sort through the hundreds and hundreds of your images, or get out your camera and/ or phone and start snapping!

This year's competition theme is all about the views of Tairua, to fit with the calendar title "Tairua on Show". The judges will be looking for the images that best show the special and spectacular aspects of the town. Remember, there is a lot more to this place than Paku! Having said that, any creative shots of our maunga will be welcomed.

As in previous years, judges will select 14 images for the calendar. Each winner will receive a free calendar, and the person whose photo is chosen for the cover will receive a canvas print of their image, all courtesy of Tairua Print.

In the interests of high print quality, your photos need to be at least 4Mb, and landscape in orientation. You can send them via email (send as "Actual" to prevent the scaling down

of pixels) to Centre Manager Eve at: admin@tairua.co.nz. Don't use any social media portals, or photos that have been uploaded to social media sites as they automatically downscale images for transmission and will not print well. These types of images will automatically exclude you from consideration based on file size - find the original photo in your Gallery or Photos app and email from there. Alternatively, you can drop your photos into Eve on a USB stick.

Each year, the proceeds from the calendar sales have been put back into the community. Both the hall annexe and Tairua Food Bank benefited from past calendar proceeds. This year's will be no different with the proceeds going to boost Tairua Information Centre (TIC) itself, as it moves forward with securing a new location.

The Centre, an independent local organisation dependent on community funding to carry out its community and tourism duties, is currently based in a Council-owned building. With TIC's lease running out, without an option to renew, Eve and the Centre's committee have been looking at finding another location, and the current plans are for a new building on Pepe Reserve. Funds towards the purchase of a suitable "small house" type building are needed to progress this idea through to reality, so the calendar sales' boost will help immensely.

Because the Tairua Information Centre Calendars are so popular Eve hopes to have it published in time for Labour Weekend, so get your entries in by 3pm, Friday 10 October.

## Our risk in the Big One

Thames Museum recently hosted the "Rūaumoko Restless Land" display, courtesy of Te Papa Museum. The earthquake display was put together to highlight the need to know what to do should the "Big One" hit.

On the Coromandel, our biggest threat is the Hikurangi Subduction Zone — an area off the East Coast. Research shows that if an earthquake of 9.1 magnitude struck in the Zone, the Peninsula could expect to face tsunami, landslide and liquefaction hazards and experience road closures, power outages and other infrastructure failures.

The Hikurangi Subduction Zone is potentially the largest source of earthquake and tsunami hazard in New Zealand making the Coromandel, a peninsula, a particular risk. A subduction zone is where a tectonic plate slips beneath another, in our case the Pacific Plate is sliding beneath the Australian Plate. Research indicates there is a one-in-four chance of a major Hikurangi Subduction Zone event in the next 50 years!

Now that we are a little more aware of potential risks we face, it is timely to consider what we do about it. "If it's long or strong, get gone," is a well-known immediate response to an earthquake, but having a plan that takes into account the initial hazard impact plus ways to cope following it, is important.

Some great suggestions to survive such a disaster include giving thought to:

- Having a home emergency plan;
- Having a workplace emergency plan;
- Having a family communications plan to give peace of mind about your loved ones;
- Having resources (food, water, alternative toileting, communications, etc) on hand to last two weeks;
- Having enough medication to last two weeks.

Community-wide, a plan has been developed too. Following the weather events of early 2023, local emergency response plans were drawn up and refined and a designated co-ordination centre at St Francis House on Main Road was identified for Tairua. In the event of a large hazard event, this is where our emergency response team will operate from. It will be supported by various groups to provide help where needed.


